ENERGY ASSISTANCE IN MULTNOMAH COUNTY

Multnomah County and partner agencies have received funding to help households impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Energy Assistance Stability Coronavirus Relief (EASCR) funds are available now but will expire at the end of this year on December 30, 2020, if they are not used.

The EASCR funds are in addition to normal assistance funding which is also available now. The amount of assistance is determined by individual household need. Call or apply today to see if your household can receive help.

HOW TO APPLY

Multnomah County is facilitating assistance through a waitlist. Call **2-1-1** or explore up to date information online at **www.211.org/energy**.

EASCR REQUIREMENTS

- One or more household members impacted by COVID-19 including, but not limited to, loss of employment, reduction or loss of income, etc.
- · Household must meet income guidelines.

 Provide current (previous 30 days) documentation of gross income OR proof of enrollment in any of the following programs: WIC, TANF, SNAP, SSI, Medicaid, OHP, LIHEAP or OEAP.

LIHEAP REQUIREMENTS

- Be a resident of Multnomah County.
- Applicant must live in the household.
- Account holder must live in the household.
- · Household must meet income guidelines.
- · Current electric bill.
- Proof of income for the last 30 days.
- Social Security cards for all household members (if applicable).
- Proof of identity (Driver's License, State ID, Military ID, etc.).

INCOME GUIDELINES

EASCR Income Guideline (80% of Area Median Income by Household Size)
